

Electronics Disposal Ban

It's the Law



State Statute 287.07(5)

Beginning September 1, 2010 it is illegal to put these electronics in the trash in Wisconsin:

- Cell Phones
- Computers – desktop, laptop, netbook and tablet
- Computer monitors
- Computer peripherals – keyboards, mice, hard drives, flash drives, external modems, speakers, and other external input/output accessories
- Desktop printers, including those that fax, scan or copy
- Fax machines
- Televisions
- Video recorders and players
